

Couplet

Definition

- A couplet is two successive lines of verse forming a unit.
- The two verses in a couplet often rhyme, are the same length, and have the same meter.

Examples

I saw a little hermit crab
His coloring was oh so drab

Hear the honking of the goose
I think he's angry at the moose

from Sonnet 29
by William Shakespeare

For thy sweet love remember'd such wealth brings
That then I scorn to change my state with kings.

from A Minor Bird
by Robert Lee Frost

I have wished a bird would fly away,
And not sing by my house all day;

Have clapped my hands at him from the door
When it seemed as if I could bear no more.
